During Friday's events, outgoing Charge Consultant Nick Flores, Beta Deuteron '22, facilitated the Alcohol Skills Training Program with undergraduate delegates. The purpose of this program is to help students who choose to drink make informed decisions about their alcohol consumption and to help them do so in a less dangerous way. Brother Flores facilitated conversations about safe drinking habits, risks of overindulging, expectancies, blood alcohol level, tolerance, and more. Undergraduates were engaged in their questions, responses, and overall attentiveness, as they played a vital role in the conversations during the session.

The Omega Service was held in the Wren Chapel. The Wren Building is the oldest academic building in the United States and is considered part of the ancient campus. Attendees filled the space to capacity. The Grand Lodge has a new offering to support New Member Education. After creating the 17th Edition of the Membership Handbook, the Central Fraternity Office started to work on new New Member Education Materials. The 2nd Edition New Member Education Materials are now being rolled out.

Usage of the materials is not required but highly suggested. Charges have a few options as they plan their New Member Education for the year. Charges can continue implementing their New Member Education Plan if it meets the standards. The program must follow the NME guidelines and format and have scripted lessons. These plans are submitted and approved annually. Charges may choose not to conduct a New Member Education Plan. In this case, they must still review the Preamble and policies with new members before initiating within one week of bid acceptance. Upon registering for both options, new members are

given new member pins and handbooks.

For groups who opt to use the 2nd edition materials, each new member receives the 17th Edition Handbook, a new member pin, and an NME workbook. These materials are free and can be used to guide new members through their process. The educators for the Charge have a curriculum guide that they can use to plan and facilitate critical lessons.

These materials were the focus of the alumni and one of the undergraduate Minerva Sessions. Both sessions focused on educating members on the new materials and their options throughout the year. The materials have a collective 14 lessons focusing on Charge and personal development. They range from Setting a Path for Academic Success, Breaking down a Project, Presentation Skills, Charge History, and more. The program empowers members to identify, connect with, and live the values.

PGL & Grand Banquet

The 177th annual Convention closed out with the PGL Reception and Grand Banquet on Saturday, August 3rd. Conventioneers were treated to appetizers and drinks prior to the main event, the Grand Banquet. With conversations flowing outside the banquet hall, they quickly transitioned into the Virginia room as the time had come for the program's start. President of the Educational Foundation, Jeff Horton, Nu Triton '90, and Annual Director of the Educational Foundation Corey Egler, Upsilon Deuteron '15, emceed the event.
