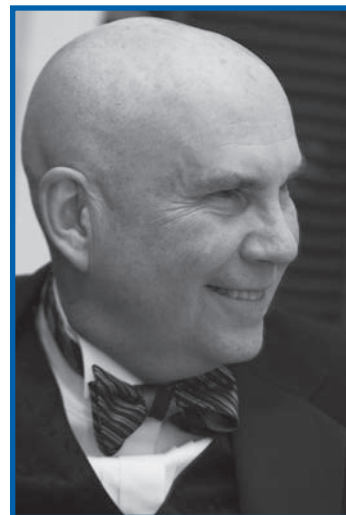

Rick Wood, Gamma Triton '73, Named New Executive Director

After earning his undergraduate degree at Michigan State University, Rick enjoyed a successful teaching career at the elementary and middle school levels. He then became a successful principal in a suburban school district outside the City of Detroit. While in this district, he was named to the position of Director of Instructional Technology and worked directly with students in the regular and alternative high school program. Following the completion of his doctoral work, he expanded his teaching experiences to the University level. Prior to assuming the position of Executive Director of Theta Delta Chi, Rick was an educational consultant working in school reform, program development and assessment along with improving student achievement.

He has served on the boards of several national organizations. His work has been recognized by National Magnet Schools of America Evaluators and the schools he has worked with have received the highest ratings possible. He also served as the Executive Director of the International Teaching and Learning Consortium for several years.

Rick became a brother in Theta Delta Chi in 1971, having been a very active member of the Gamma Triton Charge serving in many different capacities including Treasurer and President. As an alumnus, he served as the alumni advisor to the Charge for numerous years. His roles at the International level have included secretary of the Educational Foundation for approximately 15 years and most recently he served as the 64th PGL. He planned our 150th, 151st, 152nd and 153rd conventions and was named Theta Delt of the Year in 1997. Rick believes deeply in the values and mission of Theta Delta Chi.



Mystery China

The Archives of the Fraternity recently acquired the pictured item of dinnerware. It is identical in style to our substantial collection of Iota (Harvard) china, but where one would expect the name of the Charge, this serving dish has "Siwash."

Like the "Iota" china, it appears from the maker's mark on the underside to have been manufactured in 1924 or later.

The word "Siwash" is associated with a Pacific Coast indigenous tribe, but is also a nickname for Knox College in Galesburg, Illinois. It is also the name of the fictional college in stories by a Knox alumnus, George H. Fitch.



Theta Delta Chi has no records indicating any attempt at a colony at Knox College. Anyone who can shed light on this mystery is invited to contact the CFO.

As you can see throughout this issue of *The Shield*, Theta Delta Chi continues to have a monumental impact on the lives of our members, alumni and undergraduate alike. This would not be possible were it not for the dedication of the brothers named in this issue. Despite over 27,000 living alumni, only 3% made a contribution to the Educational Foundation in 2013 and supported our organization.

In past 10 years, we have grown our undergraduate membership by 33%. We have restored or colonized 11 Charges. We have instituted the Preamble Institute which continues to be an amazing opportunity for network and leadership development. We have expanded our grants programs and continue to give out over \$20,000 in scholarships every year.

If we wish to maintain or extend our programming, which we will need to do to remain competitive on our college campuses, we need the support of our alumni. And because we are a membership organization with only a small window for admission, our donor base is intrinsically limited. If you want to see Theta Delta Chi remain successful, I ask you to please make a gift to the Old Lady this year for whatever amount you can spare.

We have a lot of exciting things coming down the pipeline. The new Executive Director, Dr. Richard Wood, Gamma Triton '73, joins us with a fiery passion for the fraternity and a clear direction for the organization. One of the key focuses of the coming years will be creating new opportunities for career networking and professional training. It is imperative that we help each and every member of Theta Delta Chi leave school with practical skills that will give them an advantage in an increasingly competitive job market. An expansion of the Preamble Institute will also prove to be an invaluable resource for our membership. By adding a second delegate from each Charge, all expenses-paid, we ensure that there will be two motivated members returning back prepared to support each other as they strive to help their Charge stay atop its Greek Community. Finally, our Archives are in desperate need of restoration. Our most priceless resource and connection to our history will be lost forever if we do not make a long overdue investment in their preservation. As part of this project, we will be digitizing all of our historical materials so that every member will have remote access with full search capabilities so that anytime, anywhere you can step back in time and connect with our brotherhood.

None of this will be possible if our alumni do not step up to the plate and make it happen. In order to support these projects, we estimate that we will need the continued support of our 800 loyal annual donors as well as the support of at least 200 new donors. Will you be one of our supporters?

Saturday the "the Bros." The brothers provided him with an opportunity to further develop his confidence, self-esteem, and independence! For that, I am forever grateful...

You should be extremely proud of these wonderful young men! They have truly demonstrated responsibility, accountability, selflessness, and compassion for others — and should be commended! Far too often we hear about the negative behaviors of college students. It is my utmost pleasure to be able to share you with my gratitude for the brothers of Theta Delta Chi at the University @ Albany!

And, through their leadership, I hear that a sorority at the University @ Albany is developing a similar program for teen girls with autism! My 13 year old daughter, Madison (also with Aspergers), would greatly benefit from this type of program!

Please know that the brothers of Theta Delta Chi are a positive reflection of the University @ Albany. Cameron is already talking about enrolling there and becoming the first brother of Theta Delta Chi who has participated in "Bros United!"

Why I donate

Having just welcomed my first child into this world, a beautiful girl named Emma, it has caused me to sit back and reflect on my life up to this point, as I imagine most new fathers do. As an immigrant to the United States, I think of how different my life could have been than where I find myself now. And through it all, I’m so proud to be able to give back to our fraternity as Theta Delta Chi has had such a meaningful influence on my life since I pledged in the Fall of 1996. I want to make sure that Theta Delta Chi can continue to impact future brothers the way my life has been.

In 1979, when I was 2 years old, my dad left Vietnam to come to the US in an effort to escape the Communist Party. He traveled to Thailand on a fishing boat before being sponsored by a church in Bethlehem, Pa. My mom and I stayed back because I was too young to endure a trip in rough seas as it was common for refugees and in particular children to die during these trips. A little less than 2 years after my dad arrived in America, he sponsored my mom and I to come over. I didn’t know what was going on at the time being less than 4 years old. The only thing I do remember is crying as we boarded the plane because my grandfather was waving good bye to me. We were very close. He died 7 years later in 1988 and I never saw him again. My mom and I were fortunate enough to leave the airport in Saigon on a plane to a refugee camp in Thailand. When we arrived in America on a cold winter night in 1981, I saw my dad after 2 years and didn’t know who he was.

My dad moved us to Middletown, Pa just outside of Harrisburg. He worked as an airplane mechanic at the Harrisburg International Airport. My mom worked for a textile factory in a town near by making minimum wage. We lived in a small 800 sq/ft mobile home. We lived very modest. Growing up, I didn’t have toys, my mom either made all of our clothes or I wore hand me downs from my cousins. I never fit in with the rest of the kids at school and was often times made fun of and picked on because I didn’t have the newest pair of Nikes or the latest fashion. My first 2 years of kindergarten, I had to take ESL (English as a 2nd language) classes while other kids were at recess. My learning progress was slow because I lived in a household that spoke only Vietnamese. The only English available to me was 3 hours of kindergarten a day and Sesame Street. I shared a room with my brother Quang C.. Dang '08 in a 9x8 room up until I left for college. I didn’t understand it at the time, but my parents had a plan for my brother and me.

Fall 1996, I started college at Penn State. What a change in environment! I went from a High School of 750 kids to a college of 45,000. Like all 18 year olds, you want to fit in somewhere. I found my home away from home at Theta Delta Chi. My freshman roommate was Lynn Stump’s, '69, youngest son. He invited me out to the house and there, I

met some of the greatest guys. They made me feel welcome and a part of something special. I pledged that semester with 6 other guys who have become lifelong friends: Greg Werhner, Bill Rottschaefter, Mike Kopiak, Brian Bertges, Andrew Dougherty, and Craig Bossong.

I mentioned earlier that my parents had a plan for my brother and me. I didn’t realize what this plan was until money was owed to the school and to the house for living expenses. First day of every semester, I had 2 checks in hand. One for the Penn State and one for Theta Delta Chi. That was my parent’s plan. That was the future of our family and our success, providing education for the next generation. Keep in mind, my parents probably never made more than a combine \$50,000 a year up until 1996, yet they were writing annual checks to Penn State and Theta Delta Chi because they believed in giving us every opportunity they could.

From 1996-2001, I tried to hold as many positions as possible. Matt Miller, '96, challenged my pledge class when we were pledging. Brother Miller told us he held 7 house positions and challenged us to hold more. I took that to heart and threw myself into the fraternity. 99.9% of Penn State students got their education on campus. I got mine at 305 East Prospect Avenue. From social chair to rush chair, homecoming chair to House Manager, I ended up holding 9 different house positions during my undergraduate years. Theta Delta Chi allowed

me to do what I like best: meeting people and gave me the confidence to excel in an environment where I finally felt that I belonged with the support and encouragement of my brothers. The valuable lessons I learn from each position has helped me with my career more than any classroom lecture.

Today I am the Vice President of 1st Advantage Realty, Inc. Eight years ago, my business partners and I started RE/MAX 1st Advantage with just 4 guys and a dream. Today it is the #1 Real Estate office in the Greater Harrisburg area. Our plan for success is the same process a fraternity uses to keep it stable and healthy; meeting & talking to people, recruiting, promoting, being active with the community, and being a family. As I continue to build my career and family in Middletown, PA with my wife, Irma, and our baby daughter, Emma, I cannot help but think what my life may have been like without my experience in Theta Delta Chi. Just like how my parents worked tirelessly to support my brother and I through college, it is now my goal not just to provide every advantage for my daughter but also for every new Theta Delt.

I hope my story inspires all Theta Delts. There is nothing you can’t do in this world. Quit thinking small and dream big. Just remember where you came from and to inspire and help those who are trying to walk the same path.
